<b>PRE-TRIP CHECK LIST</b>	<b>WHAT TO TAKE ON THE TRIP</b>
Packets with itinerary, syllabus, etc.	Passport
Study Abroad t-shirt	Maps of Europe, List of "must see" sites in each city
Passport	Phrase books in French and German
Credit card	ATM card or traveler checks
Copies of passport, credit cards, etc.	WARM clothing for most of the trip;gloves/cap for Alps
Get prescriptions from doctors	Study Abroad Program book
Take medications on time during the flight to London (London is 6 hours ahead)	Journal and pen for notetaking
Check out RickSteves.com - Travel tips and Travel Store - excellent!	Group Presentation Papers/notes for your talk
"Quick Fresh" from Travelstore.ricksteves.com is good	Camera
Know how to check-in at airport (e-ticket)	Ipod
Know what to expect at the departing airport and London airport	Necessary medications
Know what to expect at hotel check-ins and check-outs	Antihistamines if allergic to cedar trees
Know what to expect on bus rides	ONE bag to check (will pay extra if over 50 lbs.)
Know how color groups work for travel	ONE carry-on bag (includes purse)
Read through the Study Abroad Program book prior to trip or on plane	No liquids over 3 oz. packed in plastic bags & no sharp objects in carry-on bag
Be sure your roommate and you are in same color group	ONE or two business suits (guys - at least one tie)
Weigh your packed bag for no more than 50 lbs.	ONE pair of business shoes
May want to pack clothes in "space bags"	Swimsuit,sandles for Nice (rocky beach no sand)
Meet with your team prior to the trip - report due by April 11	Fold-up, travel umbrella, windbreaker/raincoat
Check with your bank, credit card co. for withdrawal, cash advances,foreign exchange, foreign transaction fees	Breakfast bars or snacks
<b>NOTIFY YOUR BANK AND CREDIT CARD CO. OF TRIP</b>	Neck pillow for travel
Get the equivalent of \$50 or \$100 in British pounds at your local bank before leaving	<b>TRAVEL ALARM CLOCK</b>
Have warm clothes, jacket, umbrella in carry-on for Windsor Castle - may be chilly/rainy (won't have access to suit case at Windsor)	Small flashlight with extra batteries
<b>OTHER ADVICE FOR THE TRIP</b>	Hand-wash packets; Toilet seat covers
Toiletry bag that hangs is better (small bathrooms and counterspace)	Canvas bag for shopping-grocery stores don't have bags
Have coins for restrooms (use restroom at every opportunity)	Walking shoes
<b>LEAVE LUGGAGE UNLOCKED FOR AIRLINE FLIGHTS</b>	Wool-lite or detergent for washing clothes
Lock luggage in hotels, use hotel safe deposit or safe in room	Wash cloth (hotels sometimes don't have them)
Keep money and valuables out of sight	Downy Wrinkle Releaser (in travel size spray bottle)
Be courteous to others by respecting their right to quiet in hotels, restaurants and airports	Jeans and shorts (2 pair of each), leisure shirts
Drink lots of water on plane trip and other times	Underclothing, socks for a week
Be sure to get something to eat at Windsor	Plastic bags - zip-lock all breakables/leakables
Have sweater for bus rides - can get chilly on the bus	International cell phone (optional but advised)
Remember traffic is coming from opposite direction in London	Purchase International calling card in U.S. with English instructions and plenty of minutes
Give family members itinerary, list of hotels, phone #s	Electrical converter (if taking a small appliance, such as razor, Ipod, computer)
Pre-order museum passes on-line	Photocopy of 1st page of passport and hotel list for wallet or purse
