ADDITIONAL BOARD MEMBERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

A number of additional opportunities to interact with MIS students are available to CMIS board members, dependent upon level of membership.

Fall and Spring Board Meetings

MIS curriculum updates and new initiatives are all possible topics of discussion at the semester board meetings. Student, faculty and industry presentations about hot topics in technology may also be included.

Fall and Spring CMIS Case Competition

The CMIS Case Competition and networking reception offers Texas A&M students an opportunity to sharpen their analytic, presentation and teamwork skills. The competition also serves as an excellent forum for CMIS board members to interact with MIS students in an academic setting, as member companies are invited to send judges.

CMIS Summer Workshop

The CMIS Summer Workshop is a 1.5 - day event for MIS undergraduates. They attend guest speaker presentations about various leadership-related topics and career fair preparation, participate in small and large group team building activities and get to know fellow MIS students on a more personal basis. Representatives from CMIS board member companies are invited to a reception for a chance to meet the newest MIS students.

Women in Technology Conference

The Women in Technology Conference is designed to help female MIS students network with other women who are currently building their careers in the information technology industry. Senior executives, managers, professionals and new hires share insights with students on a range of topics, including trends in technology, securing a job, advancing careers, finding a mentor and balancing the demands of work and personal life. All CMIS board member companies receive complimentary registrations to attend the conference; additional registrations are available at a cost.

Speed Networking and MIS Mixer

CMIS board members are invited to send two representatives to a speed networking event. Students meet one-on-one with representatives for a seven-minute session. They then rotate until they have met with each representative. Student résumés are provided at this event, just before the fall Career Fair. After this event, the Mixer is an opportunity for all MIS students to meet CMIS board members in an informal setting.

MIS Career Fair

Professionals from corporate board members have the opportunity to talk with MIS undergraduate students in a career fair environment.

Sponsorship and Scholarship Opportunities

CMIS board members may also sponsor events hosted by student organizations or organize student field trips to their companies. In addition, board member companies may fund scholarships for deserving students throughout the year. Additional events honoring high GPA students may be scheduled throughout the year.
