**Eligibility**

This application form is for graduate students only (G7 classification). To be considered for a scholarship, you must be a TAMU graduate student with an MISY or PPA-MISY major. In addition, you must meet the following criteria:

- Enroll in at least 9 credit hours during each term in which the scholarship is funded (i.e., Fall 2024 and/or Spring 2025).
- Have completed at least **three graduate-level** Mays Business School courses from your degree plan at the time of application.
- Submit your completed application with supporting documents by the application deadline.

**Selection Criteria**

Overall GPA, degree plan GPA, hours completed, extracurricular involvement, and essay responses will be used as the selection criteria. Applicants must meet the general eligibility criteria outlined above, as well as any additional criteria outlined by the donor for each specific scholarship.

This application will be used for all scholarships available for which you qualify during the application period.

1. Complete the application form and print it.
2. Attach the following supporting documents (in the stated order):
  - a. a copy of your unofficial TAMU transcript (printed via Howdy)
  - b. a copy of your current résumé (be sure your extracurricular involvement is accurately reflected)
  - c. a list of any other funding you have received (type, amount, and dates) for your education at TAMU (e.g., scholarships, GA positions, grants)
3. Submit your completed application form with supporting documents to the INFO Students Services Office (315 Wehner) by the deadline listed above.
